

- Good hand washing should always happen before eating or drinking. Nail brushes should be used if necessary. Hand washing should also occur at the end of the day before going home. Good hand washing is also advised for reducing risks from Covid.
- Clothes used for work should be either laundered at work, or at home in a dedicated load of washing. Washing work clothes with leisure clothes or children's clothes should be avoided. The same applies for rags/towels used for wiping golf clubs and golf balls during play.
- Contact with the site with bare hands should be minimised.
- Golf balls and tees should be kept away from the mouth. The use of the ball washing facilities at each hole should be encouraged. The water in these facilities should be changed on a regular basis.
- Try and avoid entering any pooled water or the brook to retrieve lost items. If necessary, limit the amount of time in contact and make sure to wash hands thoroughly afterwards.

There can be an odour present at the exit of the culvert and associated manholes on the site. Previous investigations have shown there to not be a risk to human health from this odour, so should not be a cause for concern for site users.

#### ***When to contact the Council***

Please contact the Council if any changes are noted at the site, such as a significant increase in ponding of water at the surface (where ponding usually occurs), new areas of ponding, depressions in the surface of the land or if an increase in odour is noted. The Council will assess the situation and advise accordingly.

If you wish to do any works at the site please contact the Council before commencing. It is likely that under the terms of the lease that formal Landlord consent will be required for any works therefore an application for Landlord's consent will be required. This process is likely to take at least 4 weeks (longer if other consents, permissions or licences are required.)

Any proposed changes to the site, including the erecting of structures and/or additions to existing structures will require Landlord consent (note that this is separate to planning consent). Full details of the works must be provided to the Council. When applying for Planning Consent please ensure that the Council in its' capacity as landowner is notified.
